This variation agreement and any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of or in connection with or its subject matter or

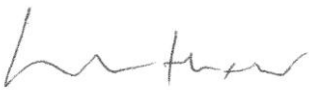
formation shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the law of England and Wales.
